## The Impact of Motorsports On North Carolina and the Greater Charlotte Region

- Total Economic Impact = \$ 6.5 Billion Statewide
   \$ 5 billion for the Charlotte region
- Projected impact by 2017 = \$ 11 billion statewide
   \$ 8.5 billion in the Charlotte region
- Statewide total (direct and indirect) employment projected in 2017 at 41,000 and 30,000 for the Charlotte region.
- Charlotte region provides 77.15% of the total state economic output related to motorsports and 72.65% of the total state employment impact.
- Current average direct compensation package per job stands at \$76,742 per year.
- These high paying jobs will become more competitive as 40% of them are classified as Precision Production, Craft, Repair, Machine Operators, Assemblers and Inspectors.
- The education requirements to hold a job in the motorsports industry will rise as jobs become more technical and employees compete for positions in this specialized labor pool. A total of 20% of jobs in the motorsports industry are currently held by employees who have a college degree.

- The industry is growing at a real growth rate of about 5.85%, driven by several factors:
  - Continued growth of the NASCAR Nextel (Sprint) Cup Series
  - 2. The growth of the NASCAR Craftsmen Truck Series
  - 3. Popularity of the NASCAR Busch (Nationwide) Series
  - 4. National television exposure
  - 5. Shift in fan base from open wheel racing to NASCAR
  - 6. Promotion of new tracks
  - 7. Availability of sponsorships
- The growth of the motorsports industry in the Charlotte region is projected to grow at a rate of 5-6% per year over the next five years driven by:
  - 1. The expansion of testing facilities
  - 2. The new NASCAR Hall of Fame Museum –set to open in Charlotte in 2009
  - 3. A good economic climate and political support
  - 4. Continued growth in the general demographic fan base
  - 5. Expansion of drag racing industry and related suppliers
  - 6. Relocation of new race teams to the region
  - 7. Improved professionalism and maturation of the sport
