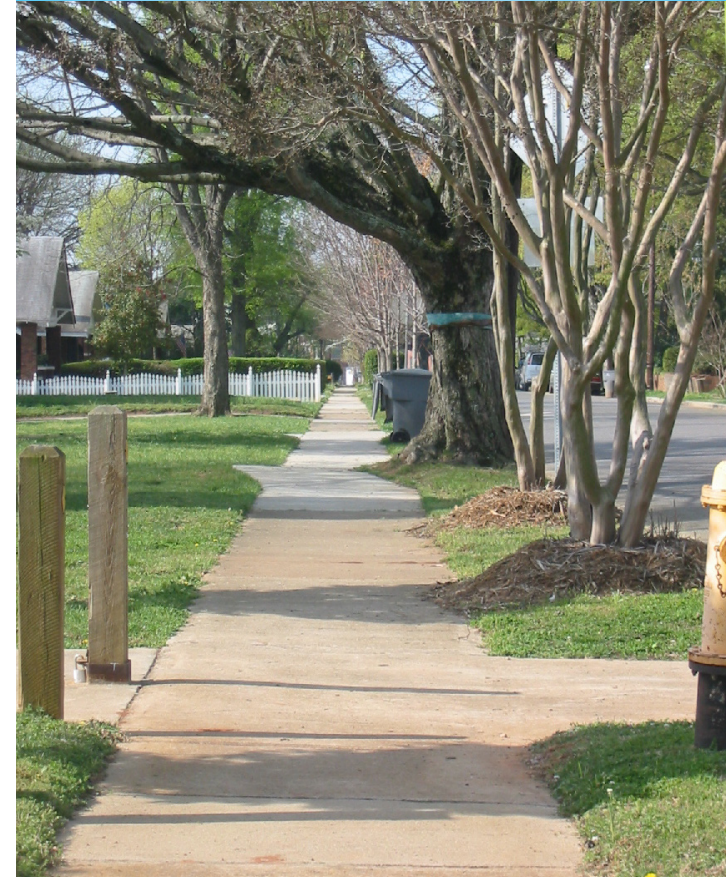

Public meeting results

The second public meeting for the Delta Lake Neighborhood Improvement Project (NIP) was held January 8, 2008 at Hickory Grove Presbyterian Church. The City's consultant, Kimley-Horn, discussed the NIP area and scope, summarized input from the first public meeting, presented two conceptual alternatives for neighborhood improvements and received input regarding a preferred alternative.

The alternatives are summarized below.

Alternate 1: Sidewalk/Curb & Gutter

- Curb and gutter on both sides of Delta Lake Drive and a five-foot wide sidewalk on the north side of Delta Lake Drive
- Curb and gutter on both sides of Lisa Circle and Michael Drive (within the NIP project limits), curb and gutter on the north side of Demill Lane and a five-foot wide sidewalk on the north side of Demill Lane, Michael Drive and Lisa Circle (within the NIP project limits)

Alternate 2: Curb and Gutter

- Curb and gutter on both sides of Delta Lake Drive, Sebring Court, Vero Lane, Lisa Circle and Michael Drive (within the NIP project limits)

Based on the input we received at the meeting, the unanimous preferred alternative was Alternate 1. However, since the second public meeting, it has been brought to the City's attention that some of the residents residing on Demill Lane, Lisa Circle and/or Michael Drive do not want sidewalk in this area. As a result, a neighborhood led petition is being passed around for signature by those who disagree with the proposed sidewalk on Demill Lane, Lisa Circle and Michael Drive.

Next steps

Depending on the results of the petition process, a third public meeting may be necessary to obtain more input from residents. We will keep residents informed of our progress as appropriate via mail and will provide notification within two weeks of another public meeting (if needed).
