DELTA LAKE NEIGHBORHOOD IMPROVEMENT PROJECT

Public meeting results

The first public meeting for the Delta Lake Neighborhood Improvement Project was held on September 13, 2007 at Hickory Grove Presbyterian Church. The project team presented an overview of the Neighborhood Improvement Program (NIP), the project boundaries, the existing neighborhood conditions and an explanation of the scope and goals of the NIP process. Examples of infrastructure improvements were shown. The goal is to balance available funds, needs and feasibility to find the most appropriate improvement plan for Delta Lake.

After the presentation attendees divided into smaller groups to voice concerns, priorities and recommendations. Residents' knowledge of the neighborhood brought many critical issues to light.

Comments included:

- Drainage improvements needed on Delta Lake Drive, Delta Lane and Lisa Circle
- Flooding on Delta Lake Drive caused by Heron Pond Development
- Water main problem on Delta Lake Drive between Sebring Court and Delta Lane
- Water quality of the lake has deteriorated since new development; lake needs to be preserved
- Sidewalk, curb and gutter requested for Delta Lake Drive, DeMill Lane and Lisa Circle
- Street lighting upgrades and/or additions needed throughout neighborhood
- Traffic calming (speed humps) requested on Delta Lake Drive
- "No Outlet" and "No Littering" signs needed in neighborhood
- Lisa Circle needs landscaping

Next public meeting

The next public meeting will be held this winter to present alternatives and prioritize improvements. The project team welcomes additional input from residents at any time.
