Subdivision to Offer EPLAN Submittal Option

Electronic **subdivision** plan (EPLAN) submission is now available to help streamline the submittal and plan review process. This new **alternative** will help support a greener environment and reduce printing and courier costs. A PDF version of the subdivision plans, required documents and a copy of the application should be submitted electronically to the Land Development inbox at ldplans@charlottenc.gov. Plans will be submitted for review once the fees are collected. Fees should continue to be submitted to the One Stop Permitting Center on the lobby level of the Charlotte-Mecklenburg Government Center.
