COMMISSIONER'S COURT

NORTH CAROLINA

MARCH 24, 2011

The Gaston County Board of Commissioners (BOC) met in Regular Session on March 24, 2011 at 6:00 pm in the Commissioners Room, Gaston County Courthouse.

Chairman Donnie Loftis presided with Commissioners Tracy L. Philbeck, Vice-Chairman; Chad Brown, Joe D. Carpenter, Tom Keigher and Mickey Price in attendance.

Commissioner Allen R. Fraley was not in attendance.

Others present included Jan Winters, County Manager; Charles L. Moore, County Attorney; and Martha M. Jordan, Clerk to the Board.

Upon request of Chairman Loftis, Commissioner Philbeck led those assembled in the Invocation and Commissioner Price led in the Pledge of Allegiance.

Public Hearing - Zoning Map Change - Application Z11-01: Kimberly D. and John H. Harrill (Applicants); Kimberly D. and John H. Harrill, Lisa and Kevin J. Gantt (Property Owners); Property Parcels: 157097, 157096, and 157094 Located on Old Fallston Road (Secondary Road 1648) from R-1 (Single Family Limited) Zoning District to the R-3 (Single Family General) Zoning District

Chairman Loftis announced the Public Hearings as advertised; explained procedures to be used; called for the motion to enter into Public Hearings.

On motion introduced by Commissioner Brown and seconded by Commissioner Price, the BOC unanimously entered into Public Hearings.

With a quorum of the Planning Board being in attendance, Chairman Loftis recognized Mr. David Williams, Planning Director, for comments regarding Z11-01.

Mr. Williams explained that the application identified above contained three parcels - one undeveloped parcel; one with a stick built dwelling; one with a single wide manufactured home - surrounding zoning is R-1; located within the northwest small area of the Comprehensive Plan; aerial map identified location near Baxter and Old Fallston Roads going west; R-2 zoning east of Baxter Road; consistent with the Comprehensive Plan; one call received in opposition to the application; applicant is in attendance to answer any questions.

Chairman Loftis called for citizen comment, questions from the Planning Board or the BOC, and with none being heard moved to the next item of business.

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Public Hearing -Zoning Map Change - Application Z11-02: Angelita and George Foster (Applicants and Property Owners); Property Parcels: 152411 and 152412 Located on County Line Road (NC 216) from the R-1 (Single Family Limited) Zoning District to the R-2 (Single Family Moderate) Zoning District

Mr. Williams advised that both parcels were undeveloped; surrounding zoning is R-1; located within the northwest small area of the Comprehensive Plan; parcels total about two acres; pointed out via aerial map as being east of the Cleveland County line and south of T.R. Foster Road; mostly R-1 with some R-2 zoning and C-3 to the south; consistent with the Comprehensive Plan; received one call for information; applicant is in attendance to answer any questions.

Chairman Loftis called for citizen comment.

Mr. Claude William Hinson, 1718 Countyline Road, stated that he had no objection to the application although he did have a concern regarding the low water table; 152411 becomes a lake after a three day rain; 152412 also gets two small lakes after a rain; applicant does have some land that perks; my well is 42' deep; could not afford to sink a new well; concerned about new tenants impact to the water table; this is in Crowders Mountain Township and not Cherryville.

Commissioner Brown asked that the areas mentioned be pointed out on the map.

Chairman Loftis called for any questions from the Planning Board and with none being heard, called for questions from the BOC.

Commissioner Carpenter indicated that Mr. Hinson may have a bored well; that a drilled well would use a different aquifer of water; it would be much deeper and not affect the water table of Mr. Hinson.

Citing the water issue, Commissioner Brown expressed concern about increased occupancy if someone wanted to install a mobile home park.

Mr. Williams stated that manufactured home parks were no longer permitted under the Unified Development Ordinance.

With comments coming to a close, Chairman Loftis excused the Planning Board to Room 2029 for deliberations.

<u>Public Hearing & Adoption To Authorize the Sale of Real Property for Economic Development Pursuant to N.C.G.S. § 158-7.1 (REPI S.p.A.)</u>

Chairman Loftis recognized Mr. Donnie Hicks, EDC Director, for comments.

Mr. Hicks recognized Ms. Elizabeth Balenchia, business consultant for REPI S.p.A, and Mr. Wayne McAllister, EDC Chairman; advised that two companies would be relocating to the Gastonia

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Technology Park; one being REPI, an Italian company located just outside Milan; REPI makes colorants for the plastics industry; will be building a 30,000-40,000SF building in the Technology Park and employing about thirty people; pays above average wages; will occupy 7.75 acres; the County will transfer 7.75 acres in the Park at no cost; REPI will waive the County grant; will be responsible for paying County taxes from date of eligibility; City of Gastonia will provide a grant.

Chairman Loftis called for any citizen comments and with none being heard called for questions from the BOC.

The County Attorney pointed out that the documents were in draft form awaiting review with Ms. Balenchia; may be some minor changes; Plat map included indicates that REPI would receive Lot 1; just over seven acres; would pick up the other 3/4 of an acre with property line adjustments.

Commissioner Philbeck asked if any major deviations would be brought back to the BOC.

The County Attorney responded "yes" indicating that this was a simple agreement for property conveyance that sets out conditions with the City of Gastonia.

On motion introduced by Commissioner Philbeck and seconded by Commissioner Brown, the BOC unanimously approved **2011-065** as follows:

NOW THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED, that Gaston County Board of Commissioners:

- The Chairman of the Gaston County Board of Commissioners is authorized to execute the necessary documents to convey to REPI S.p.A.
 the real property more particularly described below: Gastonia Technology Park, Subdivision Map prepared by Foresite Engineering and
 Surveying Lot 1 (plat attached-Exhibit A); Plat Book 76,Page 55 of the Gaston County Registry
- 2. The conveyance of the property to REPI S.p.A. will stimulate the local economy, promote business, and result in the creation of a substantial number of jobs in Gaston County that pay at or above the median hourly wage in the county. The median hourly wage in Gaston County, as determined by the North Carolina Employment Security Commission, is \$16.33 per hour. The probable median hourly wage at the facility to be constructed by REPI S.p.A. is \$17.00 which is above the current median hourly wage in the county. This determination of the probable median hourly wage at the facility is based upon materials provided to the County by REPI S.p.A.
- 3. The fair market value of the property, subject to the covenants and conditions associated with the GTP, is approximately \$193,750, subject to survey. This determination of fair market value is based upon an appraisal of the property by J.C. Morgan Company, a copy of which is on file in the office of the Gaston County Economic Development Department.
- 4. As consideration for the conveyance of the property, REPI S.p.A. has agreed to construct on the property a headquarters, research and development, and manufacturing facility at a cost of at least \$5,500,000. A copy of the contract is attached to this resolution. This facility will generate property tax revenues over the next 10 years in an amount at least sufficient to return to the county the fair market value of the property.

<u>Public Hearing & Adoption To Convey Land in the Gastonia Technology Park for an Economic Development Project Pursuant to NCGS 158-7.1 (LANXESS, LLC)</u>

Mr. Hicks recalled the groundbreaking on March 9 at the Technology Park; recognized Mr. Jim Coccagno, in attendance from Lanxess, Pittsburgh, PA; advised that Lanxess compounds high technology polyamide resins; Governor will contribute \$250,000 of One NC Money; County must match that amount in three years; Lanxess notified the Governor's Office that they would create 55 jobs paying substantially above County wage; County will convey a 15 acre newly developed site on the back side of the Technology Park; the proposed 55,000SF building could be expanded in the future; traditional production; will be receiving help from the City of Gastonia since Lanxess is a fairly

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large electrical customer; City will create a new power transformation to European standards; City is providing credit offsets for transformers; has also agreed to fee waivers including building permit and availability fees; County will give Lanxess the property, a tax grant, and a \$100,000 site development grant to cure deficiencies between the County's site and the competing site.

Chairman Loftis called for citizen comment and with none being heard, called for questions from the BOC, and with none being heard, called for the motion.

On motion introduced by Commissioner Carpenter and seconded by Commissioner Price, the BOC unanimously approved **2011-066** per Budget Change Request, as follows:

NOW THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED, that Gaston County Board of Commissioners:

- The Chairman of the Gaston County Board of Commissioners is authorized to execute the necessary documents to convey to Lanxess
 Corporation the real property more particularly described below: Gastonia Technology Park, Map 3, Tract 2 (plat attached-Exhibit A) of
 a plat prepared by LDSI and recorded in Book__, Page__ of the Gaston County registry.
- The conveyance of the property to Lanxess Corporation will stimulate the local economy, promote business, and result in the creation of a substantial number of jobs in Gaston County that pay at or above the median hourly wage in the county. The median hourly wage in Gaston County, as determined by the North Carolina Employment Security Commission, is \$16.33 per hour. The probable median hourly wage at the facility to be constructed by Lanxess Corporation is \$21.96 which is above the current median hourly wage in the county. This determination of the probable median hourly wage at the facility is based upon materials provided to the County by Lanxess Corporation.
- The fair market value of the property, subject to the covenants and conditions associated with the GTP, is \$398,375. This determination
 of fair market value is based upon an appraisal of the property by J.C. Morgan Company, a copy of which is on file in the office of the Gaston
 County Economic Development Department.
- 4. As consideration for the conveyance of the property, Lanxess Corporation has agreed to construct on the property a plastics manufacturing facility at a cost of at least \$15,000,000. A copy of the contract is attached to this resolution. This facility will generate property tax revenues over the next 10 years in an amount at least sufficient to return to the county the fair market value of the property.
- In addition, the Board approves an appropriation of \$100,000 for a site development grant to Lanxess Corporation pursuant to the attached Budget Change Request which is attached hereto incorporated herein by reference.
- 6. The Board further approves additional assistance to Lanxess Corporation outlined in the Economic Development Agreement attached hereto marked Exhibit B and incorporated herein by reference.
