The Housing Appeals Board hears appeals taken from decisions or orders of a City of Charlotte Neighborhood Development Code Enforcement official. Any citizen aggrieved by an order issued by Code Enforcement may file an appeal to the Board within 10 calendar days of service. Once heard, the Board may uphold, modify, or set aside the order.

The nature of the cases usually involve disagreements due to a demolition order, and the appellant wants a repair order, the appellant wants more time to respond to an order, or the appellant disagrees with one or more of the issued violations. The Board heard 16 appeals cases out of the 3,689 code cases generated in Fiscal Year 2007, with only one appealed to Superior Court.

There are five Board members, including two appointed by the Mayor, one of whom must be a person who owns and occupies his or her principal residence within the City Within A City (CWAC) area. Three members are appointed by Council, one of whom must be a person who maintains as his or her principal residence a rental dwelling located in the CWAC area, and one of whom must be a person who owns or is employed by a firm engaged in the construction or management of housing.

Board members have a three-year term with a twoterm limit and include: Carl Adam Barrington III, Bryan Bennight, Katina Stavrakas, Regina Tisdale, Joyce Davis Waddell, Chairperson.

Meetings are held the second Tuesday of each month, starting at 1 p.m. in Old City Hall Conference Room 4
