


INTRODUCTION


The image of Charlotte's suburbs is one of rapid growth and development with pristine neighborhoods and subdivisions. Socioeconomic problems such as unemployment, crime, and poverty are usually not associated with suburban neighborhoods. However, this report identifies several suburban areas that are showing signs of distress. If these problems are not addressed in a timely manner, these areas could potentially become Charlotte's next ring of threatened and fragile neighborhoods.

The Neighborhood Statistical Area Assessment profiles and assesses conditions in suburban areas beyond the boundaries of City Within A City (CWAC) but within the City of Charlotte's political sphere of influence. (See Map 1) Although this report is similar in content to the CWAC assessment, the geographic areas profiled in this report are defined as Neighborhood Statistical Areas (NSAs). In most cases, Neighborhood Statistical Areas represent a combination of several neighborhoods and subdivisions. Also, the way in which Neighborhood Statistical Areas are classified differs significantly from the CWAC assessment report. This document classifies neighborhood statistical areas into two categories-1) areas showing signs of distress and 2) areas showing little or no signs of distress. Although entire NSAs are classified as areas showing signs of distress, in some cases, the problems are only concentrated in smaller areas and not representative of the entire NSA. Where this was the case, every effort was made to isolate and identify the smaller geography or location where the problems exist.

This report identifies areas outside of CWAC that need attention. However, because the neighborhood statistical areas are larger and the variables used to classify them are different, these areas cannot be directly compared to the fragile, threatened and stable neighborhoods in CWAC in terms of the amount of socioeconomic and physical distress. Also, caution is expressed in interpreting the results from this report because most of the data used to classify the areas is from the 1990 Census. Conditions in some of these areas may have improved or worsened. This suggests that a more detailed analysis of each neighborhood statistical area showing signs of distress should be done to assess the magnitude of the problems.

Finally the information contained in this report in no way suggests that attention and investments in CWAC neighborhoods should be reduced or redirected to other areas. The tremendous physical and socioeconomic needs of CWAC's fragile and threatened neighborhoods still warrant continued attention and investments. The challenge for local government becomes how to work in partnership with other public and private agencies and being more proactive in preventing these neighborhood statistical areas from experiencing the kind of distress and problems that plague some inner city neighborhoods.

DATA COLLECTION PROCESS

To collect the data, areas within Charlotte's sphere of influence, which essentially includes areas within the city limits and the unincorporated portion of Mecklenburg County, were divided into 80 geographic areas called neighborhood statistical areas (NSAs). The social and economic information for these areas was collected using Census block groups. Block groups are geographic areas designated by the Bureau of the Census for which data is collected. Because development is not as compact in the suburbs as in the inner city, block groups cover a large geography. The size of the block groups resulted in a combination of neighborhoods being grouped together to form neighborhood statistical areas.

Since several neighborhoods are located in an NSA, the NSAs were not given names. Instead, the neighborhood statistical areas are assigned identification numbers. The identification numbers for the 80 NSAs range from 100 to 270.

The data was collected from a variety of sources. The socioeconomic data (i.e. population, housing, income, education, and employment) was compiled from available 1990 Census information. Crime statistics (based on 1994 offenses) were provided by the Charlotte Mecklenburg Police Department. Information on storm water complaints was provided by the City's Storm Water Services Division. The remaining data (community resources invested or targeted to an area, and the list of neighborhoods and number of neighborhood organizations) was compiled by planning staff and/or collected from other agencies or key business units. A total of forty-seven variables were collected for each neighborhood statistical area.

METHODOLOGY

To classify the neighborhoods, 18 of the forty-seven variables were selected to analyze. These eighteen variables were chosen because collectively they are fairly good indicators of a community's overall socioeconomic and physical health. Listed below are the 18 variables used for this analysis.

Socioeconomic Variables

- 1. Households on Public Assistance
- 2. Female Head of Household Below Poverty
- 3. Female Head of Household With Children Below Poverty
- 4. Married With Children
- 5. White-Collar Jobs
- 6. Blue-Collar Jobs
- 7. Unemployed
- 8. Households With No Vehicle
- 9. High School Graduates
- 10. Housing Values Under \$60,000
- 11. Renter Occupied Housing

Crime Variables

- 1 Violent Offenses
- 2. Non-Violent Offenses
- 3. Drug Arrests

Infrastructure Variables

- 1. Storm Water Critical
- 2. Storm Water Priority

Community Facilities Variables


- 1. Parks
- 2. Recreation Centers

Using the 18 variables, a quantitative methodology called principle components analysis was done to group the variables that were found to be highly correlated. This analysis reduced the 18 variables to four new variables- Poverty, Blue Collar/Education, Crime/Renters, and Storm Water. These four new variables were principally used to assess the neighborhood statistical areas overall health and stability.

Each neighborhood statistical area was then evaluated based on their ranking on the four variables. Neighborhood statistical areas that ranked in the top 25 percentile on three or more variables or on at least two of the social variables (Poverty, Blue Collar/Education and Crime/Renters), were classified as Areas Showing Signs of Distress. Neighborhood statistical areas that ranked in the top twenty-five but didn't score on at least two of the social variables, or didn't score on any of the variables were classified as Areas Showing Little or No Signs of Distress. (See Map 2)

Of the 80 neighborhood statistical areas analyzed, 20% or (16) are classified as areas showing signs of distress. The remaining 80% or (64) of the neighborhood statistical areas are classified as areas showing little or no signs of distress. Although entire NSAs are classified as areas showing signs of distress, in some cases, the problems are only concentrated in smaller areas not the entire NSA. Every effort was made to isolate and identify the smaller geography or location with the problems within the NSA. If the smaller area could be identified, it is highlighted on the NSA boundary map in the neighborhood statistical area profiles section of this report beginning on page 14.

NEIGHBORHOOD STATISTICAL AREA CLASSIFICATION

AREAS SHOWING SIGNS OF DISTRESS

As shown on Map 3 and Table 1 below, sixteen (16) of the 80 neighborhood statistical areas are defined as areas showing signs of distress. As mentioned, areas classified as showing signs of distress scored in the top 25 on three of the key variables or on at least two of the social variables. Of the 16 neighborhood statistical areas showing signs of distress only 1 scored in the top twenty-five on all four variables, 6 on three variables, and 9 on two variables.

Of the seventeen neighborhood statistical areas showing signs of distress:


- The areas are generally located in the ring just outside of the CWAC area.
- The areas are scattered throughout Charlotte but the majority are concentrated in the northwest, southwest and northeast.

- The areas are usually located in clusters that consist of at least two neighborhood statistical areas.
- The majority (13) scored in the top 25 on the Poverty and Crime/Renters variables.

Below is a matrix that summarizes the problems of the *neighborhood statistical areas* showing signs of distress.

AREAS SHOWING LITTLE OR NO SIGNS OF DISTRESS

As shown on Map 4 and Table 2, the remaining 64 neighborhood statistical areas are classified as areas showing little or no signs of distress. NSAs in this classification are those that may have ranked in the top twenty-five but didn't score on at least two of the social variables and those that didn't score on any of the four variables. Of these 64 neighborhood statistical areas 30 scored in the top 25 on (1) of the key variables and 14 on (2) of the key variables. Generally, these NSAs most often scored on the Storm Water, Blue Collar/Education and Crime variables.

This information suggests that the overall conditions of these areas are relatively healthy in comparison to the *neighborhood statistical areas* showing signs of distress. It also suggests that few areas are free of any problems. Most areas are in need of some level of services to preserve and maintain them.



- Twelve scored in the top 25 on the **crime/renters** variable (*NSAs* 128, 148, 152, 158, 162, 168, 208, 212, 214, 224, 230 and 260)
- Twenty-one scored in the top 25 on the **Stormwater** variable (*NSAs* 100, 106, 108, 110, 114, 116, 124, 154, 158, 164, 166, 182, 192, 194, 210, 212, 214, 218, 230, 238 and 244)

Neighborhood Statistical Areas Showing Little or No Signs of Distress Map 4




NEIGHBORHOOD STATISTICAL AREA PROFILES

This section profiles social and physical characteristics of each of the 80 neighborhood statistical areas. The areas are grouped by their classification i.e. areas showing signs of distress and areas showing little or no signs of distress and are listed in numeric order of the neighborhood statistical area.


The first page of the neighborhood statistical areas profile lists key social characteristics (population, household type, crime, education, employment, income, etc.) and key physical characteristics (housing, infrastructure, community facilities, etc.). The data is reported by both a numeric and percentage total for each item. Also listed is a figure for the total area or the City's Sphere of Influence to use as a guide to compare numbers for the neighborhood statistical areas with the rest of the City and unincorporated areas.

The second page shows a map of the *neighborhood statistical area* and lists the neighborhoods and subdivisions located within the *neighborhood statistical area*. Also listed are the number of neighborhood organizations within the neighborhood statistical area. This information was compiled from single family and multi-family subdivisions and neighborhood organizations that are registered with the Planning Commission.

Definitions, sources of data and further explanations are listed in the appendix of this report that begins on page 183.




Neighborhood Statistical Areas Showing Signs of Distress Map 3







AREA MAP(4)







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Appendix

DEFINITIONS, EXPLANATIONS AND SOURCES

SOCIOECONOMIC PROFILE

The data in this section of the report was taken from the 1990 Census of Population and Housing and the 1990 Census of General Social and Economic Characteristics.

POPULATION

<u>Total Population</u> - The total number of people living in a neighborhood statistical area.

<u>Black Population</u> - Total number of persons who are Negro, African American, Afro-American, Black Puerto Rican, Jamaican, Nigerian, West Indian, or Haitian living in a neighborhood statistical area.

<u>Children under 18</u> - Includes the total number of children living in a neighborhood statistical area who are seventeen years old or younger.

Elderly, 65 & Over - Total number of people living in a neighborhood statistical area who are 65 years old and older.

HOUSEHOLDS

<u>Total Households</u> - Total number of households in the neighborhood statistical area. A household includes all persons who occupy a housing unit. A housing unit is a house, an apartment, a mobile home, a group of rooms, or a single room that is occupied as separate living quarters. Because this is complete count data, the total household count is different from the number given for total households under the income category.

One Person Head - Total number of households in the neighborhood statistical area in which only one person is designated as the head of the household. This person could be male or female.

<u>Married With Children</u> - Total number of households where the man and woman live together, are legally married and their children live in the same house with them.

<u>Female Head With Children</u> - Total number of households that are headed by a female with children and they live in the same house. There is no husband or adult male living in the house.

<u>Households With No Vehicle</u> - Total number of households in a neighborhood statistical area where no passenger car, van, truck or other vehicle is kept at home and available for use by household members.

CRIME

This information was provided by the Charlotte Mecklenburg Police Department.

<u>Total Offenses</u> - Total number of illegal acts or offenses committed in an area.

<u>Drug Arrests</u> - Total number of arrests made in an area that were drug related i. e. trafficking, purchasing or using.

<u>Violent Offenses</u> - Total number of violent acts (homicides, rapes, robberies/armed and strong armed, and aggravated assaults) committed in a neighborhood statistical area.

Non Violent Offenses - Total number of non violent acts (burglary, auto theft, and larceny) committed in the area.

<u>Rate Per Thousand</u> - The rate or frequency of occurrences of a particular type of crime for every 1,000 residents that live in an area. For example, if an area's crime rate per 1,000 for drug arrests is 7.11. This means that for every 1,000 residents in the neighborhood statistical area there were approximately 7 arrests made.

EDUCATION

Adults, 25 and Over - The total number of adults that are at least 25 years old or older that live in the area.

<u>High School Graduates</u> - The total number of persons in the area who received either a high school diploma or the equivalent, for example passed the General Educational Development (G. E. D.), and did not attend college.

<u>College Graduates</u> - The total number of persons in the area that attended college and received some type of formal college level degree.

OCCUPATIONS

Adults in Labor Force - Total number of adults (persons 18 years or older) in the area in the labor force. Labor force includes all persons classified as employed or unemployed plus members of the U.S. Armed Forces.

White Collar Jobs - Includes the total number of persons employed in managerial, professional, technical, sales and administrative work.

<u>Blue Collar Jobs</u> - Includes the total number of persons employed in services, production, transportation, laborers, and household (domestic) work.

<u>Unemployed</u> - Includes total persons 16 years old and over who are currently not working and/or are available to accept a job.

INCOME

<u>Total Households</u> - An estimated number of households in the area. The total household number for this category of information is estimated based upon a sample number of households that were interviewed by the census bureau. This count is different from the complete count figure given in the household section on the first page of the neighborhood profile.

This section also includes a count of the households with incomes within various income ranges. Household income includes the income of everyone in the household 15 years old or over whether related or unrelated.

<u>Families Below Poverty</u> - Includes the total number of families in the area with incomes below the poverty level as determined by the U. S. Census Bureau. The average poverty threshold for a family of four persons was \$12,674 in 1989.

Households On Public Assistance - Includes the number of households receiving public assistance. Public assistance income includes (1) supplementary security income payments made by the Federal or State welfare agencies to low income persons who are aged (65 years old or older), blind or disabled; (2) aid to families with dependent children, and (3) general assistance. Separate payments received for hospital or other medical care (vendor payments) are excluded from this item.

<u>Female Households Below Poverty</u> - Total number of households in the area headed by a single female where the household income is below the poverty threshold.

PHYSICAL PROFILE/COMMUNITY RESOURCES

This information was obtained from a variety of sources. The Housing Characteristics was taken from the 1990 Census; Storm Water, Community Facilities, Community Resources Committed, Neighborhood Organizations and Neighborhood Names were taken from information submitted by various departments or information on file in the Planning Commission office.

HOUSING CHARACTERISTICS

<u>Total Units</u> - Includes the total number of houses, apartments, mobile homes or trailers, group of rooms or a single room in the area. Both occupied and vacant housing units are included in the total.

Occupied Housing Units - Includes the total number of units in the area with a person or persons living in them.

Vacant Housing Units - Includes all unoccupied units in the area.

Owner-Occupied Housing Units - Includes all units in the area where the owner or co-owner lives in the units.

<u>Renter-Occupied Housing Units</u> - Includes all units in the area that are not owned by the person or persons living in the units.

<u>Boarded-Up Units</u> - Includes all units in the area that are vacant and the windows and doors are covered by wood, metal, or masonry to protect the interior and to prevent entry into the housing units.

<u>Housing Value Less Than \$60,000</u> - Includes the total number of housing units in which the total value of the structure is estimated to be less than \$60,000.

STORM WATER DRAINAGE RATING

<u>Storm Water Drainage Rating</u> - Includes the total number of storm drainage problems reported in a neighborhood statistical area. Repairs are prioritized using the following categories:

Storm Water Critical - Hazards to public safety, flooding of living space, damage or threat of structural damage to homes.

Storm Water Priority - Flooding of crawl spaces and mechanical equipment, broken drains.

Storm Water Primary - Creek and ditch erosion, blockage by vegetation and trash. No threat of damage to houses or structures.

COMMUNITY FACILITIES

This information consists of an inventory of the number of public and private facilities such as schools, day care centers, parks, etc. School facilities were counted if they were actively being used for a school or an administrative use.

COMMUNITY RESOURCES COMMITTED/TARGETED

Adopted Area Plan - Includes all land use plans that have been prepared by the Planning Commission and adopted by the City Council for the area.

<u>Area Plan Funds</u> - Fund established to help implement adopted area plans. The funds are administered by the Planning Commission and used to pay for physical improvements identified in area plans.

<u>Innovative Housing Fund</u> - City program used to fund various housing projects. This money is usually used to leverage private sector investments to develop affordable housing for low and moderate income people. The monies are administered by the Community Development Division of Neighborhood Development Key Business. (Most of these funds are used for areas

located in City Within A City, so there are not many neighborhood statistical areas that have these funds allocated for use.)

NEIGHBORHOOD STATISTICAL AREA ORGANIZATIONS

<u>Total Organizations</u> - Includes total number of tenant or homeowner organizations and all other organized associations or groups in a neighborhood statistical area that are registered with the Planning Commission.

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
