


As the economy grew...





...so did the County's population...




...along with CMS enrollment.



The County responded by


approving \$1.5 billion in bond referenda...

for building infrastructure...






which increased the County's debt service payments...










This was all made possible by growing County tax revenues...




As the national economy slid into recession...




...so did North Carolina...



...and Mecklenburg County.




As a result, declining revenues...












...with discretionary services leading the way, ...



...including reductions for the Library.






Reductions were significant.

Reductions	Amount
FY09 mid-year reductions	-\$41.5 million
FY10 budget reductions	-\$75.6 million
FY10 mid-year reductions	-\$20.0 million
FY11 budget reductions	-\$71.1 million
